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1 He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will abide in the shadow of the Almighty. 2 I will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress, my God, in whom I trust." 3 For he will deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the deadly pestilence. 4 He will cover you with his pinions, and under his wings you will find refuge; his faithfulness is a shield and buckler. 5You will not fear the terror of the night, nor the arrow that flies by day, 6nor the pestilence that stalks in darkness, nor the destruction that wastes at noonday. 7 A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. 8You will only look with your eyes and see the recompense of the wicked. 9 Because you have made the Lord your dwelling place—the Most High, who is my refuge— 10 no evil shall be allowed to befall you, no plague come near your tent. 11For he will command his angels concerning you to guard you in all your ways. 12 On their hands they will bear you up, lest you strike your foot against a stone. 13You will tread on the lion and the adder; the young lion and the serpent you will trample underfoot.

Welcome, in the Name of Jesus! A half century ago, during the "cold war," Russian Premier Nikita Khrushchev predicted that his nation would defeat the United States from within. Of course, Russia itself suffered an inner collapse of its own economy and power twenty years later.

Kruschev fully expected the social fabric of our nation to collapse under the subtle and steady influence of socialist-communism which had gained a foothold after World War II. We well remember how many churches at that time, especially in the south, preached against communism because of its strong opposition to "religion" – Christianity in particular.

Every student of modern history is familiar with Karl Marx, the father of socialist-communism. We were reminded recently of his statement, that "the first requisite for the happiness of the people is the abolition of religion." Marx and his followers believed that religion is "the opiate of the people."

While it is true that religion — any religion — can become like a feel-good-drug to people, it is also true that for Marx and others of this persuasion, the ultimate goal is to create dedicated servants of the state, who know no higher "worship" than to serve the "common" cause as the state defines it.

We do not preach against socialist communism, since it is a political form of government, and Christ did not commission His Church to preach against forms of government. However, this does not mean that we should not address the "religious" aspects of this human philosophy.

In fact, in respect to its philosophy that the worship of God is detrimental to the people, socialist-communism is really quite similar to Humanism and the theory of Evolution, both of which reject the worship of God. They too believe that God is not real, that those who worship Him are foolish and ignorant. They too believe that man alone is the master of his fate. They too believe that

happiness results when man is devoted to the raising up of man and the institutions man creates for this purpose.

Religion is as religion does. People who are merely "religious," work and slave, out of desperation and fear in the service of some idea of "god." It makes no difference whether "god" is a form of government or man himself. "Religion" comes from the sin-darkened thoughts and desire of the human heart and mind. It does nothing to produce true and lasting happiness. Where is the truly "happy" humanist, evolutionist, or communist who rejects God? Can we point to even one who is "happy" with his condition or writes "happily" about it?

Only one "religion" has not arisen from the human heart. Only one has been revealed to man. It is not foolishness or ignorance; but "the fear of the LORD is the beginning of wisdom"! (Ps. 19:9) Only one religion says, "Blessed (literally: happy) is the man whose sins are forgiven, ... Blessed is the man to whom the Lord does not count iniquity" (Ps. 32:1-2) Only one offers a Savior to mankind Who promises: "Come unto Me, all you who labor and are heavy laden, and I will give rest to your souls." (Matt. 11:28)

The Christian religion is not a philosophy of fear, but freedom in Christ; our faith is not about what man must still do to save himself, but what the God-Man has done to save us all. As Jesus prayed to His Father: "This is eternal life, that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ, Whom You have sent." (John 17:3) "Blessed (happy) are all they who put their trust in Him."

OLD TESTAMENT READING — **Proverb 11:23-31** The desire of the righteous is only good, But the expectation of the wicked is wrath. 24 There is one who scatters, yet increases more; And there is one who withholds more than is right, But it leads to poverty. 25 The generous soul will be made rich, And he who waters will also be watered himself. 26 The people will curse him who withholds grain, But blessing will be on the head of him who sells it. 27 He who earnestly seeks good finds favor, But trouble will come to him who seeks evil. 28 He who trusts in his riches will fall, But the righteous will flourish like foliage. 29 He who troubles his own house will inherit the wind, And the fool will be servant to the wise of heart. 30 The fruit of the righteous is a tree of life, And he who wins souls is wise. 31 If the righteous will be recompensed on the earth, How much more the ungodly and the sinner.

EPISTLE READING – John 11:41-53 Then they took away the stone from the place where the dead man was lying. And Jesus lifted up His eyes and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. 42 And I know that You always hear Me, but because of the people who are standing by I said this, that they may believe that You sent Me." 43 Now when He had said these things, He cried with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth!" 44 And he who had died came out bound hand and foot with graveclothes, and his face was wrapped with a cloth. Jesus said to them, "Loose him, and let him go." 45 Then many of the Jews who had come to Mary, and had seen the things Jesus did, believed in Him. 46 But some of them went away to the Pharisees and told them the things Jesus did. 47 Then the chief priests and the Pharisees gathered a council and said, "What shall we do? For this Man works many signs. 48 If we let Him alone like this, everyone will believe in Him, and the Romans will come and take away both our place and nation." 49 And one of them, Caiaphas, being high priest that year, said to them, "You know nothing at all, 50 nor do you consider that it is expedient for us that one man should die for the people, and not that the whole nation

should perish." 51 Now this he did not say on his own authority; but being high priest that year he prophesied that Jesus would die for the nation, 52 and not for that nation only, but also that He would gather together in one the children of God who were scattered abroad. 53 Then, from that day on, they plotted to put Him to death.

CONFESSION OF FAITH

The Nicene Creed

I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

SERMON - Romans 5:12-19 Therefore, just as through one man sin entered the world, and death through sin, and thus death spread to all men, because all sinned— 13 (For until the law sin was in the world, but sin is not imputed when there is no law. 14 Nevertheless death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who had not sinned according to the likeness of the transgression of Adam, who is a type of Him who was to come. 15 But the free gift is not like the offense. For if by the one man's offense many died, much more the grace of God and the gift by the grace of the one Man, Jesus Christ, abounded to many. 16 And the gift is not like that which came through the one who sinned. For the judgment which came from one offense resulted in condemnation, but the free gift which came from many offenses resulted in justification. 17 For if by the one man's offense death reigned through the one, much more those who receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness will reign in life through the One, Jesus Christ.) 18 Therefore, as through one man's offense judgment came to all men, resulting in condemnation, even so through one Man's righteous act the free gift came to all men, resulting in justification of life. 19 For as by one man's disobedience many were made sinners, so also by one Man's obedience many will be made righteous.





Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; April 4-9, '22

Mon Isaiah 43:16-21 Listen! God has good news and deserves our attention as well as our devotion, for He controls Nature (16) and rescues us from national disasters (17). If that's not good enough (18), He has a new and impressive program (19), in which He turns Nature on its ear in order to salvage His elect people, whom He has lovingly formed for Himself (20-21). [We love them, too, as our brothers and sisters in Christ.]

Tues Luke 20:9-19 Now the bad news: people don't honor God as they ought. In fact, His servants have been bullied, abused, and maimed (9-11). Yet God hasn't given up on humanity but sent His own beloved Son to rescue man-kind (13). [We know how that went (14-15).] We regret that Hebrews (in general) continue to insist on rejecting Jesus (16) and thus are stuck with the penalty (17-20). Lord, have mercy on such foolish people!

Wed Philippians 3:4b-14 Paul was such a fool—in fact, a super-Jew (4-6) until God set him straight—that salvation is a matter of trusting God's mercy and grace in/with Jesus (7-9), who survived

death in order to prove that God's plan really works (10-11). Our compass is set on Jesus, and we stay on course until we cross over Jordan (12-14). See you there.

Thurs Isaiah 44:1-8 Hebrew people were proud of their racial heritage but confused it with something entirely different. Here God sets them straight that Jacob/Israel is God's servant, on whom He would pour His Spirit and bless a child to confess, "I am the LORD's!" and another to acknowledge God's claim on him (1-6). Almighty God, Redeemer and Rock of ages, signs His name to validate the passport of souls such as these (6-8).

Fri Luke 20:27-40 Liberal Hebrews who didn't venerate Moses tried to trick Jesus with the question: "If resurrection is real, what about Moses' marriage regulation (Deut. 25:5) for people when they are living in heaven?" Jesus got right to the point—that resurrection IS real, just as Moses said (37-38), but regulations about earthly relationships do not apply to heavenly relationships (34-36). That makes sense (39), and it's God's good judgment besides.

Sat Philippians 3:17-21 We are familiar with the admonition to note/take note of certain persons—but this time its purpose is not to avoid them (as in Romans 16:17), but rather in order to join with them (fellowship) in following the pattern of the Apostle Paul's walk of life (17). He names some of them in verses 2 and 3 of the next chapter. Then in mid-stream Paul switches back to those who don't share this walk of life, who are enemies of the cross of Christ, who serve their selfish appetites—and it's obvious that God's children should steer clear of them. We trust God's good judgment on this. Amen.
