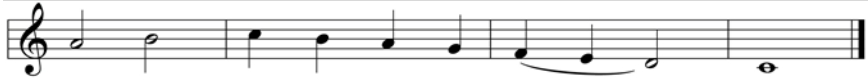

EPISTLE READING – Philippians 3:17-21 Brethren, join in following my example, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern. 18 For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that they are the enemies of the cross of Christ: 19 whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame—who set their mind on earthly things. 20 For our citizenship is in heaven, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, 21 who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.

GOSPEL READING – Matthew 19:23-29 Then Jesus said to His disciples, “Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. 24 And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.” 25 When His disciples heard it, they were greatly astonished, saying, “Who then can be saved?” 26 But Jesus looked at them and said to them, “With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible.” 27 Then Peter answered and said to Him, “See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?” 28 So Jesus said to them, “Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration, when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. 29 And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother [a]or wife or children or [b]lands, for My name’s sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life.

C I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.

And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by Whom all things were made; Who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, Whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father and the Son, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, Who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

SERMON – 1Samuel 7:5-12 And Samuel said, “Gather all Israel to Mizpah, and I will pray to the Lord for you.” 6 So they gathered together at Mizpah, drew water, and poured it out before the Lord. And they fasted that day, and said there, “We have sinned against the Lord.” And Samuel judged the children of Israel at Mizpah. 7 Now when the Philistines heard that the children of Israel had gathered together at Mizpah, the lords of the Philistines went up against Israel. And when the children of Israel heard of it, they were afraid of the Philistines. 8 So the children of Israel said to Samuel, “Do not cease to cry out to the Lord our God for us, that He may save us from the hand of the Philistines.” 9 And Samuel took a suckling lamb and offered it as a whole burnt offering to the Lord. Then Samuel cried out to the Lord for Israel, and the Lord answered him. 10 Now as Samuel was offering up the burnt offering, the Philistines drew near to battle against Israel. But the Lord thundered with a loud thunder upon the Philistines that day, and so confused them that they were overcome before Israel. 11 And

the men of Israel went out of Mizpah and pursued the Philistines, and drove them back as far as below Beth Car. 12 Then Samuel took a stone and set it up between Mizpah and Shen, and called its name Ebenezer, saying, "Thus far the Lord has helped us."

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; August 8 - August 13, '22

Mon Luke 12:22-31 After speaking about covetousness, Jesus also warns His disciples about anxiety. This unproductive concern also afflicts people in connection with earthly possessions: food, clothing, etc. Here, too, the answer is the assurance of your heavenly Father's care. We can surely trust our Maker, who provides so well for plants and animals, to clothe and feed us even better. May His will be done!

Tues Luke 12:32-34 Remembering that through Christ we have heavenly riches is what keeps us from setting our hearts on earthly possessions. Because the King of heaven watches out for us now and gives us eternal riches forever, we can afford to be generous with earthly wealth instead of coveting it or being anxious about it.

Wed Genesis 15:1-6 Abraham had just conquered kings to rescue Lot and now the LORD comes to Him and says, "Fear not!" What might he fear? That He would remain childless and the blessing for all nations would not come! But God persuades him again that He will provide both the earthly heir and the promised Savior. "And he believed the LORD" (v6).

Thurs Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-12 When God persuades us to trust His Word, we come to know about our future (which cannot be seen) and about the past which we cannot see, the creation of the world. As we saw in yesterday's reading, Abraham also lived not by what he could see, but by trusting what he was promised by God.

Fri Hebrews 11:13-16 All the faithful patriarchs of the Old Testament lived by the same faith as we do. Their heart was not fixed on the things of this earth, but on a heavenly country to which they journeyed through life. This is how God has always provided for His children on earth.

Sat Jeremiah 23:23-29 The faith of Abraham, Sarah, and all the Old Testament believers was sparked and nurtured by the Word of the LORD which came to them. Thus it is not a matter of pride for the LORD to be so concerned that people receive His true Word and no counterfeit, but it is a matter of life and death for us.

“The Master’s Minute”

(Radio broadcast – Columbia, SC 8/18/08)

Welcome to the Master’s Minute! From the opening ceremony to the grand “bird’s nest” stadium, the Chinese hosts of the 2008 Summer Olympics created a great spectacle for the human eye! But what also meets the eye of many Americans and Christians is not so great.

Three hundred and thirty-seven beautiful Chinese girls, serving the athletes as ushers and waitresses were something to see on first glance! They all had to weigh between 110 and 120 pounds; all had to be 5'6" to 5'8" tall, and all were required to have a smile that shows 6-8 teeth! All these girls were trained for months to smile, speak, and walk in lock-step fashion. We saw Chinese children who had been taken from their families as small children to be trained for the Olympics and permitted to see their parents only once a year!

All this portrays China’s power to deny the freedoms we Americans enjoy. What is not seen at the Olympics in China is the power of the Gospel of Christ to bring the greatest freedom of all to the Chinese. The Communist party has tried to stamp out Christianity. Chinese Christians may belong to a Christian church, but they are forbidden by the government to talk about Jesus outside the church.

Still, they go about quietly speaking of their Savior in hushed tones, because He has set them free from their greatest enemies – Satan, sin, and the power of hell. As Jesus said: “If you abide in My word, you are truly My disciples. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.” (Jn. 8:31)

The real heroes in China today are not its politically enslaved Olympic athletes, but those quiet Christians who “abide in Christ’s word” and freely confess His saving name. Theirs is no game, but the fight of faith. We salute them and pray for their victory in Jesus Christ!
