

OLD TESTAMENT READING – Isaiah 11:1-10 There shall come forth a Rod from the stem of Jesse, And a Branch shall grow out of his roots. 2 The Spirit of the Lord shall rest upon Him, The Spirit of wisdom and understanding, The Spirit of counsel and might, The Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. 3 His delight is in the fear of the Lord, And He shall not judge by the sight of His eyes, Nor decide by the hearing of His ears; 4 But with righteousness He shall judge the poor, And decide with equity for the meek of the earth; He shall strike the earth with the rod of His mouth, And with the breath of His lips He shall slay the wicked. 5 Righteousness shall be the belt of His loins, And faithfulness the belt of His waist. 6 "The wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, The leopard shall lie down with the young goat, The calf and the young lion and the fatling together; And a little child shall lead them. 7 The cow and the bear shall graze; Their young ones shall lie down together; And the lion shall eat straw like the ox. 8 The nursing child shall play by the cobra's hole, And the weaned child shall put his hand in the viper's den. 9 They shall not hurt nor destroy in all My holy mountain, For the earth shall be full of the knowledge of the Lord As the waters cover the sea. 10 "And in that day there shall be a Root of Jesse, Who shall stand as a banner to the people; For the Gentiles shall seek Him, And His resting place shall be glorious."

**EPISTLE READING – Matthew 3:1-12** In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, 2 and saying, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand!" 3 For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah, saying: "The voice of one crying in the wilderness: 'Prepare the way of the Lord; Make His paths straight.' " 4 Now John himself was clothed in camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey. 5 Then Jerusalem, all Judea, and all the region around the Jordan went out to him 6 and were baptized by him in the Jordan, confessing their sins. 7 But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming to his baptism, he said to them, "Brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? 8 Therefore bear fruits worthy of repentance, 9 and do not think

to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father.' For I say to you that God is able to raise up children to Abraham from these stones. 10 And even now the ax is laid to the root of the trees. Therefore every tree which does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire. 11 I indeed baptize you with water unto repentance, but He who is coming after me is mightier than I, whose sandals I am not worthy to carry. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. 12 His winnowing fan is in His hand, and He will thoroughly clean out His threshing floor, and gather His wheat into the barn; but He will burn up the chaff with unquenchable fire."



#### **CONFESSION OF FAITH**

The Nicene Creed

- **C** I believe in one God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth and of all things visible and invisible.
  - And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of His Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, very God of very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father, by Whom all things were made; Who for us men and for our salvation came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the virgin Mary, and was made man; and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried. And the third day He rose again according to the Scriptures and ascended into heaven and sits

at the right hand of the Father. And He will come again with glory to judge both the living and the dead, Whose kingdom will have no end.

And I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and giver of life, Who proceeds from the Father and the Son, Who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified, Who spoke by the prophets. And I believe in one holy Christian and apostolic Church, I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins, and I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.


Our Lord Jesus Christ, the same night in which He was betrayed, took bread. And when He had given thanks, He broke it and gave it

Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions; Dec. 5 – Dec. 10, '22

Mon Luke 17:20-21 Jesus' first coming to this earth was in "quietness" in Bethlehem's stable. Also during His earthly ministry, the Pharisees were asking about when "God's kingdom" would come while the King Himself was right there among them. May we ever be ruled by Him!

**Tues Luke 17:22-30** To His disciples, who did listen to His Word, Jesus says that He must first suffer before they see His glory. They should not be misled by claims here and there, for when He returns all will see Him wherever they are, as with lightning in the sky. Nor should they get so wrapped up in daily living that they forget His promised coming, as with many in the days of Noah and Lot.

Wed 2 Peter 1:3-11 Our Savior God gives us everything we need for body and soul, for this life and the next. Therefore, as we await the promised coming of the eternal kingdom, let us seek those gifts which come through our faith in the forgiveness of our sins (cp.v9). By the gifts listed (vv5-7), our calling and election as members of His kingdom becomes evident.

**Thurs Malachi 4:1-3** The prophet looks forward to the day when the faith of God's followers is vindicated, and God's enemies are cast down. That age will begin and end with Christ's coming. When He

came to Bethlehem, it was the Sun of Righteousness rising with the morning rays shooting forth like healing wings.

**Fri Malachi 4:4-6** Malachi ends his book of prophecy reminding his people to live as God's people under the Law of Moses, and to look for Elijah the prophet as the New Covenant Era begins. Jesus

pointed to John the Baptist as the Elijah who was to come (Mt11:14). Under the New Covenant, fathers and sons would no longer be ashamed of each other, reconciliation would extend to generations.

**Sat 1 Timothy 6:11-16** Pursuing money has led some to stray from their trust in God (v10), but Paul urges Timothy (and us) to pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, steadfastness, and gentleness

(v11), looking forward to the second coming of Jesus at the end of this age. Whether we are looking to celebrate Christ's first or second coming, the preparation that matters most is inward, accomplished by His Spirit.

"The Immanuel Sign of Christmas"

(a "Master's Minute" radio broadcast, Columbia, SC 12/07/15)

Welcome to the Master's Minute! The Christmas signs of men and merchants are many; but the important signs of Christmas, are not given by men, but by God. Seven hundred years before the first Christmas Isaiah prophesied: "The Lord Himself will give you a sign: behold, the virgin shall conceive and bear a Son, and shall call His name Immanuel," which means "God with us." (Is. 7:14)

A mother abandon's her child by placing the hungry newborn in a Christmas Nativity set. The news media calls the child a "Christmas miracle" because he was saved from certain death. But the real "Christmas miracle" took place 2,000 years ago when a young Virgin conceived and bore the Son of God by the power of the Holy Spirit!

This is the Immanuel sign of Christmas. The Christ-Child was not saved from death; He was born of the Virgin Mary to die as the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world!

The Immanuel sign of the miraculous Virgin birth teaches us that the same Jesus who arose from the dead and now rules from heaven is God WITH us TODAY! Just think of all the signs that disturb us in this life, bringing fear and anxiety into our homes.

The Immanuel sign is above all other signs -- it tells the truth which is over all things -- it preaches safety and heavenly joy to everyone who believes in the Virgin-born Son of God, our Savior!
