Old Testament Reading

Exodus 17:1-7

¹ Then all the congregation of the children of Israel set out on their journey from the Wilderness of Sin, according to the commandment of the LORD, and camped in Rephidim; but there was no water for the people to drink. ² Therefore the people contended with Moses, and said, "Give us water, that we may drink." So Moses said to them, "Why do you contend with me? Why do you tempt the LORD?" ³ And the people thirsted there for water, and the people complained against Moses, and said, "Why is it you have brought us up out of Egypt, to kill us and our children and our livestock with thirst?" 4 So Moses cried out to the LORD, saying, "What shall I do with this people? They are almost ready to stone me!" 5 And the LORD said to Moses, "Go on before the people, and take with you some of the elders of Israel. Also take in your hand your rod with which you struck the river, and go. ⁶ Behold, I will stand before you there on the rock in Horeb; and you shall strike the rock, and water will come out of it, that the people may drink." And Moses did so in the sight of the elders of Israel. ⁷ So he called the name of the place Massah and Meribah, because of the contention of the children of Israel, and because they tempted the LORD, saying, "Is the LORD among us or not?"

¹ Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, ² through whom also we have access by faith into this grace in which we stand, and rejoice in hope of the glory of God. ³ And not only that, but we also glory in tribulations, knowing that tribulation produces perseverance; ⁴ and perseverance, character; and character, hope. ⁵ Now hope does not disappoint, because the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us. ⁶ For when we were still without strength, in due time Christ died for the ungodly. ⁷ For scarcely for a righteous man will one die; yet perhaps for a good man someone would even dare to die. ⁸ But God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Sermon Text John 4:5-26

⁵ So He came to a city of Samaria which is called Sychar, near the plot of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. ⁶ Now Jacob's well was there. Jesus therefore, being wearied from His journey, sat thus by the well. It was about the sixth hour. ⁷ A woman of Samaria came to draw water. Jesus said to her, "Give Me a drink." ⁸ For His disciples had gone away into the city to buy food. ⁹ Then the woman of Samaria said to Him, "How is it that You, being a Jew, ask a drink from me, a Samaritan woman?" For Jews have no


dealings with Samaritans. 10 Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God, and who it is who says to you, 'Give Me a drink,' you would have asked Him, and He would have given you living water." ¹¹ The woman said to Him, "Sir, You have nothing to draw with, and the well is deep. Where then do You get that living water? 12 Are You greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well, and drank from it himself, as well as his sons and his livestock?" ¹³ Jesus answered and said to her, "Whoever drinks of this water will thirst again, 14 but whoever drinks of the water that I shall give him will never thirst. But the water that I shall give him will become in him a fountain of water springing up into everlasting life." ¹⁵ The woman said to Him, "Sir, give me this water, that I may not thirst, nor come here to draw." ¹⁶ Jesus said to her, "Go, call your husband, and come here." ¹⁷ The woman answered and said, "I have no husband." Jesus said to her, "You have well said, 'I have no husband,' 18 for you have had five husbands, and the one whom you now have is not your husband; in that you spoke truly." ¹⁹ The woman said to Him, "Sir, I perceive that You are a prophet. ²⁰ Our fathers worshiped on this mountain, and you Jews say that in Jerusalem is the place where one ought to worship." ²¹ Jesus said to her, "Woman, believe Me, the hour is coming when you will neither on this mountain, nor in Jerusalem, worship the Father. ²² You worship what you do not know: we know what we worship, for salvation is of the Jews. ²³ But the hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers will worship the Father in spirit and truth; for the Father is seeking such to worship Him. ²⁴ God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth." ²⁵ The woman said to Him, "I know that Messiah is coming" (who is called Christ). "When He comes, He will tell us all things." ²⁶ Jesus said to her, "I who speak to you am He."



→ Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions →March 13-18

Monday: Luke 9:51-56 -- Jesus face was set to go to Jerusalem, but not to destroy mankind, by nature sinful and unclean, but to save them at the cost of His very life. The human response to animosity is greater animosity, which Jesus turned and rebuked.

Tuesday: 1 Peter 1:13-16 -- Peter, whose response in Gethsemane had been to draw his sword, now points rather to the grace of God in Christ. This will move God's obedient children not to follow the passions of their former ignorance, but to conduct themselves as children of the heavenly Father.

Wednesday: Luke 22:63-65 -- The passions of ignorance included mocking God's Servant Jesus. His captors challenged His prophetic office, by suggesting that if He were a prophet He should prove it by responding to their "test." We, too, are tempted at times to put God to our tests. "If God really cared, He would..."

Thursday: Luke 22:66-71 -- After practice trials during the night, it was necessary to convene in the daytime to make Jesus' condemnation legal. This is accomplished by getting Him to testify that He is the Christ, the Son of God. For them this justified killing the Lord of Glory. For us this is the light of Salvation shining through the clouds of death.

Friday: Jeremiah 26:1-15 -- The prophet Jeremiah was sent to call people back from their evil ways to the true God. He was given the words to speak which prophesied the end of those who reject God's word. The people's passionate response was to encircle God's messenger, haul him to court, and threaten him with death.

Saturday: 2 Peter 1:19-21 -- Peter speaks of the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and reminds us that God's prophets (like Jeremiah) spoke what they were moved to speak by the Holy Spirit. Their words bring light in the darkness, and Christ's fulfillment brings the dawn of a new day in our hearts.
