Coordinating Council Summary—Spring 2023 The CLC Coordinating Council met on April 19.



This is <u>only a summary</u> of the board reports. <u>Please read the</u> <u>full Coordinating Council report</u> available from your pastor and online at www.clclutheran.net.

President (Pastor Michael Wilke)

We thank the Lord for **Pastor Michael Eichstadt's faithful service** to the Lord as the CLC president. We so much appreciated his encouraging Gospel spirit, and are very thankful for the steady hand of leadership he provided the CLC over the past eleven years. . . . We thank the Lord that **Pastor Delwyn Maas has accepted the appointment** as the CLC's new Vice President. . . . We are thankful that our **ILC teacher training program will graduate two students** this Spring: Stephen Krause and Danielle Gamble; and our **seminary will graduate one** student: Jonah Albrecht. We continue to pray that the Lord leads our CLC young people to pursue a calling into the public ministry. . . . The **overall financial condition of the CLC** has been blessed . . . Let us all remember the CLC General Fund, which supports so much of our shared Gospel ministry and is in deficit.

Board of Doctrine (Pastor Emeritus David Schierenbeck, chair)

The 2022 CLC Convention directed our **upcoming General Pastoral Conference to study** part one of the Joint Committee/Board of Doctrine Convention report and the Board of Doctrine's "What Scripture Teaches Regarding Admonition and Termination of Fellowship" — these are available in the 2022 CLC Convention *Prospectus.* In addition, "A Study of Selective Fellowship and Close Communion" will also be presented. The materials for this study will be sent out in advance. At his request, the **colloquy process** with Mr. Philip "Tony" Bolen of Aberdeen, SD has been temporarily delayed.

Board of Education and Publications (Pastor David Naumann, chair)

The 2022 CLC Convention resolved that a **Committee for Domestic Christian Day Schools** be appointed to assist the board in the work of exploring and developing a new program for the establishment of new Christian Day Schools. That committee is being formed. . . The 2022 CLC Convention also resolved to establish a Fund for Christian Education for the purpose of assisting CLC congregations in the establishment and ongoing support of Christian Day Schools. That fund has been created and named the "EduK8 Fund." The fund has a current balance of more than \$26,000. . . The members of Mt. Zion Lutheran Church in Detroit, MI, have voted to start a school and have requested help from the newly established School Committee. . .A Catechism Committee has begun working on a update/revision of the Sydow Catechism and workbook. . . The board is advancing with a project, "Teach Them To Observe All Things." a Christian Doctrine Curriculum. It is a website created to provide a year-long course to help children understand the teachings of Christianity using Bible lessons: https://sites.google.com/view/teachthemtoobserveallthings/ . . . The **CLC Webmaster's report** is included in the board's full report.

Board of Missions (Mr. Joel Krafft, chair)

We give thanks to the Lord for enabling two domestic mission congregations to become self-supporting. Mt. Zion (Detroit area) and Ascension (Tacoma, WA). The Board of Missions continues to subsidize the work of two domestic congregations: Living Hope (Appleton, WI) - Living Hope has been discussing finding a new facility and potentially starting a school. [Membership: 26 communicants, 17 children—43 total members] and Zion (Atlanta, GA area) - Over the past few years Zion has run into several problems with their 17-acre property. They have put the property on the market to sell it, with the hope of relocating to a more feasible location. [Membership: 17 communicants, 1 child—18 total members] The Committee on Domestic Fields (CDF) is preparing an outreach presentation which will be made available to CLC congregations by this fall . . . The **Traveling** Vacation Bible School (TVBS) committee has finalized the list of trips for this summer. If you are interested in volunteering and would like more information, please go to the TVBS website: http://www.clctvbs.org/tvbs. . . Pastor Joseph Kwiwalazu of Grace Evangelistic Lutheran Church (GELC - Liberia) has had meetings with an independent pastor and church leaders who formerly were with a Methodist church, and now other churches are also asking for additional information. . .The Nigeria Church of the Lutheran Confession (NCLC) has had several changes in leadership over the past few years. With new leadership, enrollment at the seminary has increased from one to ten full-time students in the five-year program. . . . The work in Zambia has faced several challenges over the past few years. Pandemic restrictions and fears brought much of the outreach and pastoral training efforts to a halt. The ZCLC has begun outreach in many rural communities where ZCLC members and evangelists have settled. The ZCLC continues the organizational work of church registration with the government, which is necessary since the Zambian government is trying to crack down on corrupt individuals who use the ministry for personal gain. . . Pastor Monotosh of the Bangladesh Lutheran Church Mission (BLCM) is actively reaching out to the marginalized Hindu population in rural Bangladesh through robust outreach programs, resulting in multiple baptisms and the establishment of new preaching stations. . . Pastor Kham (Church of the Lutheran Confession of Myanmar (CLCM) in Chin State), along with Ivan and Sam Edwards (National Lutheran Church of Myanmar (NLC) in Yangon) report that Myanmar has been struggling under the harsh rule of the military junta since the coup two years ago, causing pain, suffering, economic hardship, and uncertainty. Our brothers and sisters in the CLCM in rural Chin State are finding it difficult to provide for their families, with over two million people displaced since February 2021. Large gatherings are forbidden and quickly dispersed, so most evangelism efforts consist of small groups and in-home visits. . . Much more information on these mission fields and many more is available in the full report. Mission Helper Trip to **Nepal:** Eleven volunteers and two coordinators are making plans to travel to Nepal at the end of June for a three-week Child Evangelism trip.

The Board of Regents has made the following **appointments** (new term is through May 2025): Prof. Joel Gullerud, High School Principal; Prof. Mark Weis, Dean of Students; Prof. Joseph Lau, Assistant to the Dean of Students; Prof. Paul Naumann, Academic Dean, Prof. John Ude, Seminary Dean. . . Our **counseling program**, which is now in its third year, has shown to be a great blessing to the student body. We thank Steve Sydow and April Sydow for serving the Lord in this manner. Their schedule ensures that one of them is present each day throughout the week. . . . For a number of years, Marshfield Clinic has been providing trainers at athletic events to Immanuel and other local high schools at no cost. Unfortunately, they will no longer be able to provide this service for free, and the cost of continuing it is prohibitive . . . Our **dual-credit offerings** for the 2023-24 school year will be Science 101 in the fall semester and Psychology 102 in the spring semester. These courses allow our students to fulfill high school electives while also gaining credit for college courses.

Student Costs for 2023-2024 School Year:

- High school tuition increases \$200 to \$4,400 per year
- College tuition Increases \$200 to \$6,200 per year
- Seminary tuition increases \$200 to \$4,500 per year
- Room & board remains \$3,500 per year; Activity fees remain unchanged (\$600 high school, \$200 college/seminary)

Note: Increasing SAF and PMPE assistance helps offset the tuition increases.

Board of Trustees (Mr. Tom Lentz, chair)

The year-to-date **General Fund deficit** is \$158,076, which is historically high. The Reserve Fund will be used if the General Fund ends the year in a deficit. . . The FY 24 Trustees' budget includes a 5% increase to Old Retirement Plan payments. The total payout under the Old Retirement Plan continues to decline. Travel expenses have been increased slightly to reflect current reimbursements and rising costs. . . Given the current inflation environment, the proposed FY24 budget includes a salary increase of the anticipated cost of living adjustment (COLA) of 5% or \$149 per month. This would result in a proposed Tier 1 base salary of \$3,128 (\$4,128 Tier 2). The 5.0% increase reflects the most current inflation data available. The Board of Trustees is not recommending an additional monthly increase for FY24 beyond the cost of living adjustment. . . The standard Retirement Plan contribution was increased by \$10 per month in 2023 to \$220 per month. No further increases are planned. . . The CPB Offerings need in the FY24 Budget is an 8.7% decrease from the numbers in last fall's preliminary budget. . .The Trustees are working to develop **an ongoing** compensation plan as directed by the 2022 Convention. . . We anticipate stock market volatility so we are maintaining larger checking account balances and not moving excess CEF funds into our CLC Pooled investment account. . .We are studying the **possible sale of excess land**, as directed by the 2022 Convention.

🕂 Daily Bible Readings for Home Devotions 🕂

May 8 - May 13, 2023

Monday: John 6:60-65 – Having fed 5,000 with five barley loaves and two small fish, sustaining them for a while, Jesus pointed to this as a sign that He is the true Bread from heaven, who would sustain them eternally by His word. Many murmured. To believe that He was from heaven required heavenly persuasion (v. 65).

Tuesday: John 6:66-69 – When many were walking away from Jesus, Simon Peter speaks for the twelve, who have come to know that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God. They would not walk away from Him who has the words of eternal life (v. 68).

Wednesday: 2 Timothy 2:8-13 – Paul writes to Timothy from prison, but God's word cannot be imprisoned! The grave could not hold the Word made flesh (cp. Jn 1:14), nor will it be able to hold those who died and live with Him by faith.

Thursday: Psalm 98:1-3 – Let every new day bring a new song to the Lord, for salvation and life are His doing. Righteousness, steadfast love, and faithfulness are all His gifts unto the ends of the earth!

Friday: Psalm 98:4-6 – Resurrection praises may be sung by voices, stringed instruments, brass instruments and horns, because true praises to the Lord all come from the heart that sees Him as King and Savior!

Saturday: Psalm 98:7-9 – The praises of Him who saved us from the judgment for our sins extend to all the earth! The sea and everything in it, the world and those who dwell in it, the rivers and hills – because of Christ, who died and rose again, all can rejoice and sing, "Joy to the world! The Lord is come!"
